Burlew explains how to drift and troll at night while Captains Todd and Jon Mansur share regional migratory information and conditions for an informative, interactive evening, guaranteed to change the way you fish swordfish!



Dr. Chugey Sepulveda
Oceanside, CA

Dr. Chugey Sepulveda is a fish physiologist working at the Pflieger Institute of Environmental Research in Oceanside, CA. He has worked on both mako and thresher sharks and is currently heading up a study of the fine-scale movements of swordfish in Southern California using pop-off satellite transmitters. Sepulveda will present data obtained during the 2005 tagging season and discuss the importance and relevance movement studies have to the success and future development of fisheries in Southern California.

Captain Cory Burlew, top swordfish release captain for AFTCO two years running and The Billfish Foundation four years. He has caught more than 700 swordfish on rod and reel - releasing a large portion of those. His experience has honed his skills and perfected his tackle and techniques in hooking, fighting, and landing these elusive beasts.



Captains Todd & Jon Mansur

Captains Todd and Jon Mansur, a father and son team, have 34 years combined experience chasing these gypsies of the sea. They have followed these giants for years and know the migration patterns as well as the conditions to look for. They will also provide insights into swordfish behavior including depth from data taken from satellite tags on local fish.
